LITURGICAL NOTES

Tit. I. AD LIBITUM.

On any unimpeded feria, it is permitted to celebrate the Mass of any Saint or Feast listed in the Martyrology for that respective day.

Tit. II. ANNUAL BLESSINGS

On the following days, either in connection with the Mass, or at another time, and where it is the custom, the following blessings from the Ritual are to be conferred. When in doubt, the presumption is in favor of conferral. Blessings marked with an asterisk (*) are obligatory for pastors and religious superiors.

- *THE EPIPHANY (Jan.6) Blessings of Chalk, Gold, Incense, Homes, Water (on the Vigil).
- * THE PURIFICATION OF THE BVM (Feb. 2) Blessing of Candles and Procession.
- * ST. BLAISE (Feb. 3) Blessing of Candles, Bread, Wine, Fruit and Throats.

HOLY SATURDAY AND IN EASTERTIDE - Blessing of Homes.

EASTER DAY - Blessing of Lamb, Eggs, Bread, New Produce and Oil.

HOLY CROSS DAY (May 3), or following Sunday – Crosses for placing in fields, vineyards, gardens and etc.

NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN BAPTIST (June 24) - Blessing of Bonfires.

ASSUMPTION OF THE BVM (Aug. 15) – Blessings of Herbs, Fruits, and Flowers.

NATIVITY OF THE BVM (Sept. 8) - Blessing of Seeds and Seedlings.

ST. JOHN, APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST (Dec. 27) – Blessing of Wine.

*EVERY SUNDAY – The Asperges and Pain Benit.

Tit. III. LITURGICAL PRACTICE

A.) The clergy and laity of the Western Rite shall conform in all respects to the liturgical standards set by the Western Rite Commission and approved by the Metropolitan. No one shall introduce any modifications, variations, changes, amendments, revisions, "improvements," omissions or alterations without the approval of the Commission. Where variations from the declared norms exist, they are to be moved toward conformity with prudent haste.

B.) Priests or others who may wish to suggest changes, revisions, or new rites or usages to the Western Rite Commission may do so at any time, but no such changes shall be introduced prior to approval by the Commission and authorized by the Vicar General.

C.) On the Mass:

1a.) The Ordinary of the Mass shall follow "The Ordinary & Canon of the Mass" for the Rite of St Gregory as approved by Metropolitan PHILIP, or St. Tikhon's Canon as published by the Vicariate in 1977.

1b.) The Nicene Creed is to be recited as directed.

1c.) The normal usage will be a sung Mass with hymns, or a dialogue Mass with hymns, except that the use of Latin will follow the Latin rubrics of 1950, and the use of a vernacular other than English may follow customs traditional for that vernacular.

1d.) Concelebration is forbidden in the Western Rite.

1e.) A Mass with ministers shall not be attempted unless it can be celebrated with full ceremonial and proper dignity.

1f.) Private or solitary Masses are strictly forbidden, except that:

- A Mass announced with reasonable expectation of a congregation may be begun at the announced time although no one has appeared
- **2)** A Mass requested for a specific intention may be celebrated in case of demonstrable need.
- 3) 3.) In both 1. and 2. above, at least one server should be present.

2.) The Propers of the Mass shall follow the text of the English Missal, 1958. The pre-1955 form of Holy Week is recommended as being the ancient Western tradition, but the post-1955 form of Holy Week may be used depending on pastoral circumstances.

3.) Special commemorations or votive Masses desired in particular places will be authorized by the Commission on demand.

4.) The bread used for the Mass shall be leavened hosts. Pastors may be supplied on application to the Vicariate General.

5.) Where it is the custom or desired, the pain benit may be blessed at the Offertory Sentence and distributed after Mass. The form used shall be the prayer from the Rituale used at Ss. Denis and Seraphim in Paris or the one found in the Orthodox Ritual. The bread shall not be used for the Eucharist (cf. Supra).

6.) The laws of fasting and abstinence are those in use in the separated West in the 9th century.

a) FASTING includes that of Abstinence, and adds special requirements of its own. It affects both the kind and the quantity of food. On Fasting days, besides the obligation of abstaining from flesh-meat, the number and quantity of meals are restricted. One may eat only one full meal in a day, and that not before twelve o'clock. A collation, or about one-fourth of a meal, is also allowed. All who have completed their twenty-first year are obligated to observe the fasts of the Church, unless exempted by their father confessor for some legitimate reason. DAYS OF FASTING include:

- 1. Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays in Advent;
- 2. Every day in Lent (Sundays excepted);
- 3. Ember Days, which occur four times a year (viz. The Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays immediately after the first Sunday in Lent, in Whitsun week, immediately after the 14th of September, and immediately after the third Sunday in Advent);
- 4. The vigils of Whitsunday (Pentecost), the Assumption, All Saints, and Christmas. (Note, that when a fasting day falls upon a Sunday, it is kept on the Saturday preceding that Sunday.)
- b) ABSTINENCE affects only the kind of food, and has no reference to its quantity. On Abstinence days the faithful are obliged to abstain from flesh-meat only and the juice thereof (soup, etc.). The number of meals and the amount of food may be the same as on other days. All who have attained the age of reason are obligated to observe the abstinence commanded by the Church. DAYS OF ABSTINENCE include all Fridays throughout the year. When Christmas falls on a Friday, abstinence is not of precept.
- c) The EUCHARISTIC FAST consists of taking no food or drink (excepting water and medicines) from midnight until the reception of the Eucharist the next morning. If the Eucharist is to be received at a Mass celebrated in the evening, the Eucharistic Fast may be modified as follows: the communicant takes his midday meal as close to noon as possible, and then takes no food or drink (excepting water and medicines) until the reception of the Eucharist.¹

¹ These norms are those officially prescribed in the West by various local councils and episcopal decrees in and about the 9th century. The forms of norms, which we used to publish in the Vicariate, were those of the mid-19th century. When the Western Rite began in this country in the 19th century, the 19th century customs and guidelines were accepted as the rule, and this continued to be our use until the present. Because of the discussions by the clergy of the Vicariate at a special meeting in August 2012, Bishop JOHN has asked us to publish the "ancient rule" with the following explanation.

The practice of fasting as a spiritual exercise and discipline, practiced on different prescribed days throughout the year, is a matter of pastoral application. Each parish and each individual are unique in situation and adaptability. The pastor must remember that the practice of fasting is a communal discipline in which the individual submerges his will in the custom of the community. As the church and the individual fathers of the church caution us repeatedly, the pastor must find a median in which people can be challenged, yet which does not discourage the weakest among them or cause them to despair. Scripture reminds us that God has

7.) The vestments in use in the Western Patriarchate in 1950 shall be worn.

8.) The Blessed Sacrament shall be reserved for the sick only in a proper ciborium in a tabernacle in the Sanctuary of a parish church, never in a private chapel, much less a house, apartment, living quarters, or office. A light shall burn before it according to the rubrics.

8a) When prepared for reservation, the Sacred Host shall be touched with the species of wine.

8b) Missionaries requesting exceptions to these regulations shall present a full written petition, outlining the alleged necessities in detail and abiding strictly by any faculties granted.

9.) The Offices, more especially the Mass, shall be celebrated only in the public churches or chapels of the Rite. No private residence, home, or room chapels are permitted any priest without license and blessing. Mass is never to be celebrated in private without faculties in each instance.

Tit. IV. FIDELITY TO THE RITE

A.) Clergy and laity may transfer from or into the Western Rite according to numbers 2, 3, and 5 of the Western Rite Edict.

B.) Western Rite clergy are not to use the dress, vestments, rites, forms, or customs of the Byzantine Rite clergy at any time. Temporary exceptions are granted for us for specific services when serving with or for Byzantine clergy in a Byzantine service.

C.) On the use of Images in the Western Rite:

1.) An exception to the prohibition of Eastern customs shall be made for the cult of icons. In the use of icons in the church, home, and among the faithful, preference should be given to those of our Lord, the Theotokos (the Blessed Virgin Mary), major Catholic Saints and great feasts rather than to those of local Eastern Saints. The teaching of the VII Oecumenical Council on images and their

Our fasting tradition, anciently and until the present, is not the same as that of our Byzantine brothers and sisters. While we respect and honor the legitimate traditions of our Byzantine brethren, we also respect and honor and practice the ancient Orthodox traditions of the West.

commanded that the seasons of fasting be times of "joy and gladness and cheerful feasts" (Zech 8.19). The pastor must be very careful that he is promoting this scriptural view of fasting and not binding heavy burdens, grievous to be borne, and laying them on men's shoulders (Mt 23.4). Individuals need to be careful, each year, each fasting period, to ask the advice of their spiritual father about how they may observe the fasts. Such a discussion must take into account the context of our own Archdiocese on this continent at this time. It should also take into account our own situation: parish community, Archdiocese, regional diocese, family situation, health, and age.

theological implications shall be presented in popular form to the Western Rite laity.

2.) The use of icons shall be strictly confined to genuine icons of authentic style and suitable reproductions. The cheaply executed, westernized, commercial icons of poor design so common with dealers are to be avoided.

3.) Icons of Western Saints and themes based on good Romanesque models, such as those produced by the community of Ss. Denis and Seraphim in Paris, are encouraged.

D.) Statues shall conform to pre-schismatic usage in general.

JANUARY

On the Monthly and Weekly Commemoration of the Dead

- 1. On the first free day of each month except November (out of Advent, Lent, and Paschaltide) on which the Ferial Office is said, at least one Mass-in place of that for the day-should be a Requiem Mass. And on that day in all non-requiem Low Masses the Collect "For All the Faithful Departed" should be added, in the last place but one, to all others required. If, however, if be Rogation Monday, or an Ember Day, or a Vigil, or a day on which an impeded Sunday Mass is to be said, the monthly commemoration is postponed to the next day not similarly hindered.
- 2. Likewise, on the Monday of each week (out of Lent and Paschaltide) commemoration of the dead should be made in all ferial (non-requiem) Low Masses, by the addition of to the Collects of the day of the said Collect "For All the Faithful Departed". Requiem Mass, however, may be said if desired, when so allowed by the rubrics.

Notes for Christmastide

- 1. From Dec. 29 until Feb. 2 inclusive, when the Prayers assigned for the various Seasons are to be said, according to the Rubrics, they will be as follows: the 2nd of the BVM ("O God, who by the virgin child-bearing") and the 3rd against the persecutors of the Church or for the Metropolitan ("O God, the pastor and ruler"; usually labeled "for the Pope").² They are said even on Vigils, and within Octaves, excepting the 2nd Collect, which, in Masses of the BVM, and those wherein Commemoration is made of the same, and also in Votive Masses of All Saints, is said of the Holy Spirit ("God, who didst teach").
- 2. From the Vigil to the Octave Day of Christmas inclusive, private Votive Masses and Requiem Masses are prohibited. Funeral Masses are permitted, except on Christmas Day.
- 3. During Christmastide, it is appropriate for the Priest to bless infants and children.

Notes for the Feast of the Epiphany

- 1. At High Mass, a genuflexion is made at the words "They fell down and worshipped him" during the chanting of the Gospel by the Deacon, not while the Celebrant reads it privately.
- 2. It is proper on this day, or on the Sunday in the Octave, for the solemn announcement of the movable feasts of the new year. This is done with a specially appointed chant after the holy Gospel of the day in the principal Mass by a Priest or Deacon vested in cope without stole over his surplice. This year, the text of the announcement is as follows:

Know ye, beloved brethren, that as by God's favour we rejoiced in the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so too we announce to you the glad tidings of the Resurrection of the same our Saviour. The Sunday of Septuagesima will fall on the 3^{rd} day of March; Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the most holy Lenten fast on the 20^{th} day of March. On the 5^{th} day of May, you shall celebrate with greatest joy the holy Pasch of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ will occur on the 13^{th} day of June; the Feast of Pentecost on the 23^{rd} day of June; and the Feast of Corpus Christi on the 4^{th} day of July. The 1^{st} day of December will usher in the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom be glory and honour, for ever and ever. R. Amen

3. On the Feast of the Epiphany, the Priest may bless chalk, as well as gold, incense and myrrh. Also, throughout Epiphanytide, it is customary for the Parish Priest to bless the homes of the faithful. The texts for these rites are in the Orthodox Ritual.

Notes for Candlemas Day

- Today, before the principal Mass, the Blessing of Candles and the 1. Procession take place. At the Blessing and the Procession, the color of the vestments and antependium of the altar is violet (this antependium is removed after the Procession). The Celebrant wears alb, stole, and cope; the Sacred Ministers wear folded chasubles, or alb without dalmatics; all without the maniple. The altar is not adorned with flowers or other ornaments, and the organ is silent until the end of the Procession.
- Before the final prayer "Let us bow the knee" is said, unless the Feast occur 2. before Septuagesima, or on a Sunday.
- The Candles are held lighted in Choir during the singing of the Gospel, and 3. from the Consecration to the end of the Communion. The Celebrant at Solemn Mass holds a candle during the chanting of the Gospel, and lays it aside before he kisses the book.
- In small churches, all is observed as in the Memoriale Rituum (the 4. substance of these directions may be found in Fortescue's Ceremonies of the Roman Rite Described).

Notes for the Time after Candlemas

- Today, from Compline of the Office of the day until Compline of the 1. Wednesday in Holy Week, the final Antiphon of the BVM "Queen of the Heavens" is recited.
- From this day until Lent, in Masses of Semidouble or Simple rite, the 2nd 2. seasonal CSP is of the Saints ("Defend us") and the 3rd ad libitum (at the choice of the Celebrant). It is customary that the ad libitus prayers are chosen from the "Various Prayers to the said at Choice according to the Rubrics" near the end of the Missal.

Office Notes for Septuagesimatide

- 1. At I Vespers of Septuagesima Sunday, the double Alleluia is added to "Let us bless the Lord." Henceforward, Alleluia is not said until Holy Saturday: but at the beginning of each Hour, where Alleluia was said, there is said in its place "Praise be to thee, O Lord, King of eternal glory."
- 2. The Ferias of the time after Septuagesima are Privileged Ferias of the III Class (like the Ferias of Advent). Therefore, after Septuagesima until Ash Wednesday, the Ferial Office is always said, unless there occurs any Double Feast or a day within an Octave: in which case the Feria is commemorated at Lauds (Ant. & V. from Psalter, with Collect of the preceding Sunday), Mass, and Vespers (proper Ant. & V. from Psalter).
- 3. The Antiphons on Benedictus are said on Ferias as set forth in the Psalter, through Tuesday after Quinquagesima. But at Vespers on Ferias, the Antiphons on Magnificat are proper.
- 4. The Saturday Office of the BVM is not said in the time after Septuagesima.

Mass Notes for Septuagesimatide

- 1. In all Masses of Sundays, Feast Days, or Votives until Easter, the Tract is said after the Gradual in place of Alleluia and its verse. Gloria in excelsis is not said in seasonal Masses, and the dismissal "Let us bless the Lord" is said in place of "Depart in peace".
- 2. The colour both of Sundays and weekdays is violet, but dalmatic and tunicle continue to be worn; flowers may still be used; and the organ is played as usual.
- 3. On all Ferias until Ash Wednesday, the Mass of the preceding Sunday is repeated, but without the Tract. But "private" Low Masses may be said of a Memorial with Commemoration of the Feria.
- 4. From Septuagesima through the Tuesday after Quinquagesima, in all Masses, which are not of the Feria, except Masses for the Dead, Commemoration of the Feria is made, as in Advent.

Office Notes for Lent

- 1. At midnight, the Lenten Fast begins.
- 2. The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday, but liturgically the Lenten order of the Office does not begin until Vespers of the following Saturday, and the Office Hymns for the intervening days are those appointed for weekdays as previously.
- 3. Throughout Lent, in Masses and Offices of the season (except on the IV Sunday), the altar may not be adorned with flowers or other ornaments, and the organ is silent (except it be necessary to sustain a weak choir).
- 4. From Ash Wednesday, all Octaves cease until Low Sunday inclusive.
- 5. On Ash Wednesday and the other Ferias until None of Saturday, all is said as in the Psalter, except what is appointed in the Proper. After this, all is said as given in the Proper of the Season.
- 6. On all Lenten Ferias, until Wednesday in Holy Week, in Choir, the Preces at Prime and Compline, the Pater Noster before the Collect, and the Collect or Collects at all the Hours are said kneeling.
- 7. On Lenten Ferias, the Collect of Lauds is said at all the Hours through None. (The second Collect given in the Proper for each Feria is said only at Vespers.)
- 8. The Ferias of Lent and Passiontide are Privileged Ferias of the II Class. Therefore, in the Office, Greater and Lesser Doubles and Memorials are merely commemorated during Lent.

Mass Notes for Lent

 During the whole of this season, which includes Passiontide, flowers should not adorn the altars and the organ should not be played (except on the 4th Sunday) unless it be necessary to sustain a weak choir; voluntaries and interludes should be rigorously eschewed; the color is purple; folded chasubles and the "broad stole" are worn in cathedrals and principal churches (in default, the deacon and subdeacon minister in albs - on no account in dalmatic and tunicle).

- 2. But on the 4th Sunday (Lætare), rose color may be used; tunicles (violet, in defect of rose) are worn; and flowers may be used.
- 3. If, on a Lenten Feria, there is a Feast of lower rank than a Double of the II Class, the Priest is at liberty (subject to the rubrics) to celebrate the Mass of the Feria, or in lieu thereof, Low Mass of the other with the necessary commemoration and prescribed Last Gospel respectively.
- 4. At Solemn Mass, the Sacred Ministers wear folded chasubles in place of the Dalmatic and Tunicle.
- 5. From Ash Wednesday up to the Saturday before Passion Sunday, inclusive, when the Collects assigned to the different Seasons are to be said according to the Rubrics, except in Masses of the BVM, or those in which she is commemorated, and also except Votive Masses of All Saints and on Vigils, they will be the 2nd to ask the prayers of the Saints ("Defend us") and the 3rd for the living and the dead.
- 6. Gloria in excelsis is omitted in Masses which are of the Lenten Season, but it is said on all Feast Days. The Creed is said on all Sundays and on Feast Days where it is appointed.
- 7. From Ash Wednesday to Palm Sunday (both inclusive), the Tract always follows the Gradual except on such Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays as are Ferias. In the Tract "O Lord, deal not with us after our sins", all kneel at the verse "Help us, O God" (the Sacred Ministers on the edge of the predella) while the choir sings it but no one kneels when the Celebrant reads it quietly in a Sung Mass.
- 8. The Preface of Lent is said from Ash Wednesday until Saturday before Passion Sunday, inclusive.
- 9. In Ferial Masses of Lent, there is said "Humble your heads before God" with the proper "Prayer Over the People." (OSP)
- 10. In Lent, there are no monthly and weekly commemorations of the faithful departed at Mass.

The Ceremonies of Ash Wednesday

- 1. Today, before the principal Mass, is the Blessing and Imposition of Ashes, made from the blessed palms of the preceding year. The Celebrant wears a violet cope.
- 2. In small churches, all is observed as in the Memoriale Rituum (the substance of these directions may be found in Fortescue's Ceremonies of the Roman Rite Described).
- 3. For the convenience of the faithful, it is permitted to bless ashes in the early morning, apart from the Mass, and they may be imposed at any time by a Priest in surplice and Violet stole; or in the Mass vestments immediately before or after a Low Mass. In this case, a Priest in surplice and Violet stole performs the blessing with the four prayers prescribed in the Missal, sprinkling but not censing the ashes; but the priest in these circumstances must not impose the ashes on himself. Further, on the First Sunday in Lent (presuming the solemn blessing and distribution on Ash Wednesday), the blessed ashes may be distributed in parish churches in order that the faithful, hindered on Ash Wednesday, may avail themselves of this salutary sacramental. The formula Memento, homo ("Remember, O man" &c.) is

said over each person while imposing the ashes, but no other form of service of provided.

Ashes left over should be thrown into the piscina; none should be 4. preserved.

Office Notes for Passiontide

- Before I Vespers of Passion Sunday, all crosses, including the processional cross (and the Great Rood, if accessible) and images, both in church and sacristy, are to be veiled with plain purple cloths which must not be transparent. Statues which are part of the architectural features of the building and also the Stations of the Cross need not be veiled. The altar candlesticks need not be covered, but they may be replaced by others of simpler and less costly character. The veils are not removed for any Feast which may occur.
- 2. In the Office of Passiontide, Gloria Patri is omitted at the end of the Invitatory Psalm at Matins, at the end of the last Responsory of each Nocturn at Matins, and at the end of each Short Responsory at Lauds and Vespers.
- 3. At Vespers, everyone kneels whilst the verse of the office hymn, "O Cross, our one reliance, hail!" is being sung.
- 4. From I Vespers of Passion Sunday, through the First Sunday after Pentecost (Trinity Sunday), the Suffrage of All Saints is not said at Lauds or Vespers.

Notes for the Greater Rogations

- 1. The Rogation Procession is of obligation in cathedral and conventual churches, but not strictly in ordinary parish churches; nor, in the latter case, need the Rogation Mass be celebrated except on Rogation Monday (when not impeded according to the rubrics).
- 2. Although, as stated, the procession is not of obligation in ordinary parish churches, the Litany of the Saints, if at all practicable, should be sung (or recited without chant) in procession before the principal Mass; but if the procession cannot be held it is nevertheless desirable and laudable that the Litany be recited, in the single rite, with all possible solemnity. The Litany may not be anticipated or postponed.

General Notes for Holy Week

- 3. From Palm Sunday until Low Sunday inclusive, Private Votive Masses and Masses of Requiem (with the exception of Funeral Masses) are prohibited. Funeral Masses, too, are forbidden during the Sacred Triduum and on Easter Day. Should it happen that a Funeral Mass is requested for a deceased person who died, for example, on Wednesday in Holy Week and whose burial took place on Good Friday, this Mass may be said on the Monday after Easter.
- 4. Detailed directions for the functions of traditional Holy Week may be found in Fortescue's Ceremonies of the Roman Rite Described (before the 9th edition). The English text and rubrics of Holy Week in traditional form may be found in The English Missal, in editions previous to 1958, or in "Holy Week Missal" published by Lancelot Andrewes Press.
- 5. In small churches, all is observed as in the Memoriale Rituum (the substance of these directions may be found in Fortescue's Ceremonies).
- 6. The time for the fulfilling of the Paschal Precept (receiving the Holy Communion in one's own parish church) begins on Palm Sunday, and ends on Low Sunday.

Notes for Palm Sunday

- 1. The Asperges is performed before the Blessing of Palms.
- 2. The Procession is of precept.
- 3. The blessed palms are held in the hands only during the Procession, and when the Passion and Gospel are sung.
- 4. If a Priest has permission from the Ordinary to celebrate two Masses today, he may omit the Passion in one (not the principal) Mass. In this Mass the Priest reads the last part of the Passion, beginning Altera autem die ("Now the next day") in the usual manner of the Gospel. The Last Gospel of this Mass is from the Blessing of Palms.

Notes for Tenebræ

- 1. Tenebræ refers to the liturgical Offices of Matins and Lauds as celebrated during the Sacred Triduum, sung or said by anticipation on the evenings of Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. The English text of this service may be found in The Monastic Diurnal (Oxford University Press edition), beginning on p. 285. The music in English may be found in The Monastic Diurnal Noted, Vol. II, beginning on p. 87. Rubrical and ceremonial directions may be found in Fortescue's Ceremonies of the Roman Rite Described.
- 2. The service must not be held before the altar of repose; nor on Wednesday, before the altar of reservation unless the Blessed Sacrament is removed before hand.
- 3. The altar candles, and those in the tenebræ herse, should all be of unbleached wax.
- 4. On Wednesday at Tenebræ, during the Benedictus, all the lamps throughout the church (except the one before the tabernacle) should be extinguished and not relighted until that can be done from the new fire blessed on Holy Saturday.
- 5. In small churches it is permissible to have Tenebræ on one or two only of the evenings.
- 6. If Matins is celebrated from Lauds in private recitation, the Collect "Almighty God, we beseech thee" is added at the end of Matins; and Lauds, after Pater and Ave have been said, is begun with the first Antiphon.

General Notes for the Sacred Triduum

1. During the Triduum those who pass before the Cross on the high Altar shall genuflect on one knee, with the exception of the Celebrant; and he shall do so likewise after the uncovering of the Cross on Good Friday.

- 2. Except Tenebræ (see below), the Divine Office is not sung, but only monotoned, during these three days. He that presides at the Divine Office (even at Tenebræ) wears neither stole nor cope.
- 3. At all the Hours through None of Holy Saturday, Gloria Patri ("Glory be to the Father") is omitted at the end of the Psalms and in the Responsories. The Chapter, Short Responsory, and Hymn are not said during the Triduum.
- 4. Each Hour concludes with the Antiphon "Christ for our sake", Pater in secret, the Psalm Miserere in a low voice, and the Collect "Almighty God, we beseech thee."
- 5. In the sung Office the final verses of the Psalms and Canticles are ended like the others, namely, in the ending suited to the Antiphon. When the Office is recited, at all the Hours the voice is lowered a tone at the end of each Psalm, Canticle, and division; also at the end of the Psalm Miserere which is recited after the Hours in a low tone. The Collect Concede, quæsumus ("Almighty God, we beseech thee") is said in a solemn monotone, and the last syllable is said in a lower tone, as in the Psalms.
- 6. During the Triduum, the Martyrology is not read at the end of Prime.
- 7. At Compline, the Psalms are begun at once; and after the Psalms at once is said the Canticle Nunc dimittis; followed by the Antiphon Christus factus est and the rest.

Notes for Maundy Thursday

- 1. Only one Mass is permitted to be celebrated today, and it should be celebrated with all possible dignity and solemnity: the best white vestments are worn; the high altar (but this alone) adorned with its most costly array; flowers may be used.
- 2. When the Gloria in excelsis is intoned, the Organ is played and the bells rung; after it they are silent until the Gloria on Holy Saturday exclusive. (During this time it is customary to use a wooden clapper in place of a bell.)
- 3. Today the Celebrant consecrates two Hosts, of which he consumes one, and reserves the other for the following day, on which the Sacrament is not consecrated; he also reserves some consecrated particles, in case of need, for the sick. According to Orthodox practice, the Host for Good Friday, and the particles for the sick, must be touched with a small amount of the precious Blood.
- 4. At the end of the function, a priest in surplice and white stole takes the Sacrament reserved for the sick to some remote place (it may be the sacristy; or some other seemly chamber outside the body of the church), suitably prepared, where It will be kept with a light continuously burning before It, until It is brought back at the end of the functions on Holy Saturday. From this time until the Mass of Holy Saturday, Holy Communion is not distributed, except to the sick as Viaticum; in this case, a white stole is worn.
- 5. After the Solemn Mass, Holy Water is removed from all fonts in the Church.
- 6. After the Procession, Vespers are said in Choir with the six candles lighted. After Vespers the Altars are stripped, only the Cross and the six candlesticks being allowed to remain. This holds good likewise for the next day. (But if, in any place, Vespers are not said in Choir, the stripping of the Altars takes place immediately after the removal of the Ciborium with the Blessed Sacrament.)

Notes for Good Friday

- 1. The bells and organ remain silent until Gloria in excelsis at the Mass on Holy Saturday.
- 2. The altar Cross is veiled in violet, not black. At the Presanctified Mass, the Sacred Ministers wear the folded chasubles.
- 3. The customary kisses are omitted, even those of the chalice and paten, but the Celebrant does kiss the altar. The Deacon and Subdeacon are not blessed at the Epistle and Gospel; incense is not used until the procession; and no one bows to another at any time.
- 4. The last part of the Passion, which takes the place of the Gospel, is not said on the Gospel side, but on the Epistle side, where (not at the middle of the Altar) the Celebrant, bowing profoundly and turned toward the Cross, says Munda cor meum ("Cleanse my heart") without Jube &c. and reads the remaining part of the Passion. He does not kiss the Missal.
- 5. At the Adoration of the Cross the Celebrant and the Sacred Ministers lay aside the maniple, and likewise their shoes.
- 6. The Procession from the repository takes place as on the preceding day; the humeral veil worn in carrying the Blessed Sacrament (today and always) is white.
- 7. After the usual incensation of the oblations, the altar Cross and the Altar itself are incensed in the usual manner, with the words Incensum istud &c. ("May this incense").
- 8. At the Orate fratres ("Pray, brethren") no response is made.
- 9. The Celebrant raises the Sacred Host with his right hand only in such a way that It may be seen by the faithful, his left hand remaining on the altar. At the elevation the Sacred Ministers do not raise the chasuble, nor incense the Blessed Sacrament.

- 10. After the consuming of the Blessed Sacrament, the lights, or candles, that are carried by the Clergy are extinguished. But the six candles upon the Altar are not extinguished until after Vespers.
- 11. From the Adoration of the Cross on Good Friday until None of Holy Saturday, all, even the Celebrant, in passing before the Cross on the main Altar, shall make a genuflexion.

Notes for Holy Saturday

- 1. According to the traditional order, the ceremonies of the Paschal Vigil are to take place in the morning. However, at the discretion of the pastor and in light of parish custom, the Vigil may be celebrated at a convenient hour.
- 2. The usual salutations in choir are resumed today; as also the customary kisses.
- 3. Holy Communion may be given today only in the course of the Mass, or immediately afterwards, not before, except by way of Viaticum to the dying.
- 4. At the ceremonies and the Prophecies the violet color is used. Only the Deacon when singing the Lumen Christi and the Exsultet wears dalmatic, stole, and maniple of white.
- 5. If people who are to be baptized are present, especially if there should be many of them, it is permissible to transfer to a convenient time in the morning of the same day the ceremonies of the Ritual that precede the actual administration of Baptism, namely, in the Baptism of Infants up to the word Credis ("Do you believe"), and in the Baptism of Adults up the words Quis vocaris? ("What is your name?").

Office Notes for Paschaltide

- 1. Throughout Paschaltide until None of Saturday after Pentecost inclusive, at all Offices Alleluia is added to all Antiphons when said in their entirety, as well as to all versicles and responsories. But Alleluia is not added to the versicles in the Preces of Prime and Compline, nor to Pretiosa ("Right dear") at the end of Prime. Alleluia, alleluia is added to the Short Responsories at Vespers and Lauds, as noted in their proper places.
- 2. The words Alleluia, alleluia are added to "Let us bless the Lord" at the close of Lauds and Vespers, only until the Vespers of the Saturday before Low Sunday.
- 3. All hymns of the same metre have the proper doxology "To thee who, dead, again dost live" through None of the Vigil of the Ascension, except those which have their proper ending.
- 4. The Ordinary of the Ferial Office in Paschaltide is followed for minor Double Feasts and Simple Offices when the Psalms at Lauds are to be taken from the occurring Feria in the Psalter, as well as within the Octave of the Ascension and on Friday after that Octave.
- 5. During Paschaltide, except on Doubles and within Octaves (including the Easter Octave), the Preces are said as in the Psalter. There is no kneeling at the Office in Paschaltide.
- 6. There are proper Antiphons on Benedictus and Magnificat for each of the Ferias of Paschaltide. The Collect is always taken from the preceding Sunday.
- 7. From Monday after Low Sunday through the Vigil of the Ascension, the common Commemoration of the Holy Cross is said in the Semidouble or Simple Office of the Season or of the Saints, except when there has been a commemoration of a Double, even in Concurrence, or an Office or commemoration of any Octave.
- 8. The Final Antiphon of the BVM, Regina cæli, is said at the end of the Office through None of Ember Saturday in the Pentecost Octave. Likewise, outside the Office, Regina cæli takes the place of the Angelus.
- 9. At Friday Vespers throughout Paschaltide (through the Saturday before the V Sunday after Easter), unless a Double Feast or some Octave occurs on the following day, the Office from the Chapter on is that of the B.V.M. on Saturday: and that Office is said on the following Saturday.

Mass Notes for Paschaltide

1. In the principal Mass of Sundays, Vidi aquam takes the place of Asperges me; it is begun kneeling even on Easter Day itself. Water is not blessed on Easter Day and Pentecost if the blessing of water has been done in the function on the previous day, the water then blessed being used for the aspersion on the Sunday.

- 2. Gloria in excelsis is said on Feasts and Ferias alike except in Rogation Masses and ordinary Votive Masses.
- 3. The words Alleluia, alleluia are added to the Introit; one Alleluia to the Offertory verse; and one Alleluia to the Communion verse.
- 4. The Gradual is said as usual during the Easter Octave but is omitted on and from Low Saturday, and in its place the "Great Alleluia" is said in all Masses of the Season and of the Saints, but not in Rogation Masses, nor on the Vigil of Pentecost.
- 5. The Easter Preface is said in all Masses until the Ascension, except in that of a Feast having a proper Preface.
- 6. From Low Sunday until Friday after the Octave of the Ascension inclusive, when they are to be said according to the Rubrics, the Prayers (CSP) for the different Seasons, even within Octaves, will be the 2nd of the B.V.M. ("Grant, we beseech thee") and the 3rd against the persecutors of the Church or for the Metropolitan ("O God, the pastor and ruler"; usually labeled "for the Pope").³ However, in Masses of the B.V.M. and those in which she is commemorated, as well as in a Votive Mass of All Saints, the 2nd of the Holy Ghost is said.
- 7. Throughout Paschaltide, the Paschal Candle remains in its candelabrum and should be lighted during Masses and Vespers which are sung; it may be lighted during Low Masses celebrated with some solemnity, as well as during other liturgical functions, up to the Gospel inclusive of the day of our Lord's Ascension, after which it is to be extinguished, and removed from its candelabrum after the Mass is finished.
- 8. In Paschaltide, there are no monthly or weekly commemorations of the faithful departed at Mass.

NOTE: At Sunday Mass, the Parish Priest should announce to the faithful the first two days of the Paschal Octave.

NOTE: The Priest may bless the homes of the faithful throughout Paschaltide, using the blessed water taken from the baptismal font before the infusion of the Sacred Oils. Other traditional blessings on Easter Day and throughout the season include: lamb, eggs, bread, new produce, oil, or any other kind of food.

May Devotions in Honour of Our Lady

1. In many Churches, the month of May is especially dedicated to the BVM, and celebrated with suitable practices of devotion. With reference to these, it may be noted:

- 2. In those Churches in which there is a side altar dedicated to the BVM, that altar should be used and adorned for these devotions. Where no such altar exists, however, it is quite proper to erect a special altar, or shrine, with a statue or picture of the BVM and adorned with candles and flowers. But it is not proper to expose the image under a canopy.
- 3. If the exercises of the May devotion take place at the altar of the BVM, and at the end the Blessed Sacrament is to be exposed for Benediction, this should be done at the main altar, where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved.

Notes for the Vigil of Pentecost

- 1. Tomorrow the ceremonies of the Solemn Blessing of the Font may be performed, including the six Prophecies, Litany of the Saints, and the Mass.
- 2. The Celebrant and sacred ministers are robed in violet vestments, and the candles on the altar are not lighted until the beginning of Mass, as on Holy Saturday. At the end of each of the six Prophecies, a Tract is sung and a Collect read, but "Let us bow the knee" is not said.
- 3. At the end of the Prophecies, the Celebrant puts on a violet cope, and while the procession moves toward the font, the Tract Sicut cervus ("As the hart") is sung. The Font is blessed, as on Holy Saturday. Where there is no Font, the Litany begins after the Prophecies and Collects.
- 4. The Litany of the Saints is sung, as on Holy Saturday; and at the verse Peccatores ("We sinners") the Priest and his assistants go to the sacristy and put on the red vestments, and the candles are lit on the altar. At the end of the Litany, Kyrie eleison is sung solemnly, without Introit, as on Holy Saturday. At the Gloria, the bells are also rung and the organ begins being played.
- 5. Where these ceremonies are not performed, a simple Mass of the Vigil may be said, with the Introit Cum sanctificatus.

Notes for the Feast of Pentecost

- 1. The Feast of Pentecost is the second greatest feast of the year, and its Octave has precisely the same rank and privileges as are attached to that of Easter and should be celebrated with equal splendor and solemnity.
- 2. The color is red throughout the week, including the Ember Days, the Octave ceasing before the 1st Vespers of Trinity Sunday on which no reference is made to the Feast of Pentecost.
- 3. In the "Great Alleluia" all genuflect while the verse "Come, Holy Ghost" is being sung, but no one kneels while the Priest reads it privately.

- 4. Like Easter, Pentecost retains its ancient Sequence Hymn Veni, Sancte Spiritus and it is said at every Mass up to and including Saturday.
- 5. At Vespers daily, all kneel whilst the first verse of the Office Hymn Veni Creator is sung. This hymn is also said at Terce throughout the whole Octave, instead of the ordinary hymn Nunc Sancte nobis Spiritus.

Office Notes for Pentecosttide

- 1. The Suffrage of the Saints at Vespers and Lauds is resumed, until Passion Sunday exclusive, on Sundays, Ferias, Vigils (except the Vigil of All Saints), and in the Saturday Office of the BVM, unless there is a commemoration of a simplified Double or of some Octave
- 2. Today, from Compline of the Office of the day until Compline of the Wednesday in Holy Week, the final Antiphon of the BVM Ave "Mary we Hail Thee" (Salve Regina) is recited.

Mass Notes for Pentecosttide

1. From this day until Advent, in Masses of Semidouble or Simple rite, the 2nd seasonal CSP is of the Saints ("Defend us") and the 3rd ad libitum (at the choice of the Celebrant). It is customary that the ad libitus prayers are chosen from the "Various Prayers to the said at Choice according to the Rubrics" near the end of the Missal.

Notes for Trinity Sunday

- 1. Paschaltide ends with None of Saturday before the 1st Vespers of Trinity Sunday; the addition of Alleluia to the antiphons is discontinued; the recitation of the text of the Angelus is resumed this evening; and that of the Asperges on Trinity Sunday.
- 2. At Prime, when Gloria Patri has been said at the end of the last portion of the Psalm, then is begun immediately the Athanasian Symbol (Quicumque vult). The 23rd verse, in accordance with Eastern Orthodox doctrine, should be changed to read: "The Holy Ghost is of the Father through the Son: * neither made, nor created, nor begotten, but proceeding."

NOTE: At Sunday Mass, the Parish Priest should announce to the faithful the upcoming Feast of the Most Holy Body of Christ, and the upcoming Feast of Saints Peter & Paul, both of which is a Holy Days of Devotion.

Tomorrow is the Titular Feast of the Church of the Holy Trinity in Lynchburg, Virginia. It is kept there as a Primary Double of the First Class, with a Common Octave.

Notes for the Corpus Christi Office

- 1. The Feast of the Most Holy Body of Christ ranks with the Epiphany in dignity next after Easter and Pentecost.
- 2. At the Verses of the Hymns in the Divine Office, Tantum ergo and O salutaris, all genuflect if the Office is recited in Choir before the Blessed Sacrament exposed.
- 3. In the Hymn Pange lingua, according to Eastern Orthodox doctrine, the final two lines of the last Verse must be said thus: "Ever too his love confessing, who from One with Both is One."

4. The conclusion of the Hymns is of the Nativity during the whole Octave: "All honour, praise, and glory be, O Jesu, Virgin-born, to thee."

Notes for the Corpus Christi Mass

- 1. On the Sunday within the Octave, one Solemn Mass may be celebrated as on the Feast, with Gloria, Sequence, Creed, Preface of the Nativity [or ad lib. Preface of the Blessed Sacrament], commemoration of the Sunday under a distinct conclusion, and its Gospel as the Last Gospel. Solemn Vespers, II Vespers of the Feast, may be celebrated on the Sunday.
- 2. During this Octave, but not on the Octave Day, the Sequence Lauda Sion may be said or omitted at Low Masses.
- 3. During the Octave of Corpus Christi, not only private Votive Masses and Low Masses of Requiem are prohibited, but also the Requiem High Mass for the first time after death, or after the receipt of the news of a death; on the Octave Day are prohibited those Low Masses of Requiem which are otherwise allowed on the day, or for the day of death in connection with the Funeral Mass. A Funeral Mass is prohibited on the Feast itself; but if the Solemnity is transferred to the Sunday, a Funeral Mass is permitted on the Feast. Also, the Votive Nuptial Mass is prohibited during the entire Octave, but a Commemoration thereof may be made and the Solemn Nuptial Blessing given.

Notes for the Corpus Christi Procession

- 1. The Priest first celebrates Mass, during which he consecrates two Hosts. After he has consumed the one, he mounts the other in the Monstrance which will be carried in the Procession. The part of the Monstrance which holds the Host should be encircled with glass, so that the Host is visible to the worshippers. (But if the Procession is transferred to the Sunday within the Octave, the Blessed Sacrament may be exposed at the beginning of the Mass, and after the Mass the Procession is held.)
- 2. When Mass is over and the Procession has already started, the Priest, vested in white cope, will incense the Blessed Sacrament with threefold incensation, the while he kneels. Then one of the assisting clergy places a suitable humeral veil over the Priest's shoulders. The latter, covering both hands with the ends of the veil, reverently receives the Monstrance which is handed to him by the Deacon. Holding the Blessed Sacrament before his face, he turns toward the people and joins the Procession, walking beneath the canopy with his ministers escorting him. Before him walk two acolytes or clerics carrying thuribles with burning incense. All march with bared heads, holding lighted candles, and devoutly singing the hymns appointed, as the length of the Procession will permit. As soon as the Priest leaves the altar, either he himself or the clergy intone the hymn Pange lingua.
- 3. The psalms, hymns, and prayers for the Procession may be found in the supplement.
- 4. At the end of the Procession, when the Blessed Sacrament has been brought back to the church and placed on the altar, all the clergy as they kneel in reverent adoration sing the last stanza of Tantum ergo, during which the Priest incenses the Blessed Sacrament at the usual time. Two clerics sing the Versicle and Response ("Thou givest them"), and the Priest rises to say the prayer. Having made a genuflection, the Priest blesses the people with the Monstrance, making a single Sign of the Cross and without saying anything. Lastly, the Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the tabernacle.

- 5. Note that, in the Procession, the Sacred Ministers properly wear either surplice and stole, or chasubles, or copes, of white, but not dalmatics.
- 6. The Procession may take place in the evening, either on the Feast, on the Sunday, or sometime during the Octave

Notes on the October Devotions

- 1. It is a pious and laudable custom, that from Oct. 1 to Nov. 2 inclusive, in all Parish Churches and Oratories, at least Five Decades of the Rosary, with the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary and a special Prayer in honor of St Joseph, her Spouse, should be recited daily either in the morning during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, or at another time before the Blessed Sacrament exposed. The texts for this devotion can be found until the title "The October Devotions" in the Appendix to the Orthodox Ritual.
- 2. If the solemn exposition with the Ostensorium is impossible, it is possible to have this exposition with the Ciborium, namely, by opening the door of the Tabernacle while reciting these prayers, and at the end blessing the faithful with the Ciborium.

Office Notes for All Souls' Day

- 2. At II Vespers of All Saints, the Vespers of the Dead are begun immediately after "Let us bless the Lord." Pater noster and Ave Maria are not said unless out of Choir Vespers of the Dead were separated from Vespers of the preceding Feast; Vespers of the Dead are begun immediately with the Antiphon "I will walk."
- 3. The Antiphons at Vespers, as well as at Matins and Lauds, are said in their entirety before and after each Psalm and Canticle.
- 4. Compline begins immediately with the Confiteor, followed by the usual Psalms without an Antiphon. The Canticle of Simeon, Nunc dimittis, is said immediately after the Psalms.
- 5. At the end of each Psalm is said: "Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord. And let light perpetual shine upon them."
- 6. All is said as in the common Office of the Dead, except those things that are noted in the Proper of the Saints under November 2.
- 7. The Office of All Souls' is ended with the celebration of Mass after None. Vespers are of the Octave of All Saints.

Mass Notes for All Souls' Day

- 1. On All Souls Day only one Mass is authorized or allowed. The Mass that comes first in the Missal (its intention for "all the faithful departed") must be used; and also for a funeral taking place that day.
- 2. Before the Mass a catafalque, with lighted candles around it (four or six; more are allowed), should be set up in the position outside the chancel it usually occupies, for the solemn Absolution of the Dead, which should follow at the end of the Mass.
- 3. Unbleached wax candles are generally used; vestments and altar vesture are black; but if the Sacrament is reserved and cannot be removed, the frontal should be purple even though the vestments are black.
- 4. The Sequence Hymn Dies iræ is to be used entire whether the Mass (is sung or said.

- 5. Communion may be given but the assistant (other than the Sacred Ministers of the Mass) should wear a violet stole as would be done if Communion were given today outside Mass.
- 6. As mentioned above, a funeral may take place today but in that event the prayers of the funeral Mass are added above one conclusion to those appointed for the day. During the seven days following All Souls' Day, a Requiem Mass celebrated by request for any particular soul or souls has all the privileges of an anniversary Mass provided it is celebrated with chant.

Office Notes for Advent

- 1. All Ferias throughout Advent until the day before the Vigil of the Nativity of our Lord, inclusive, are Privileged Ferias of the III Order. On Advent Ferias, the Ferial Office is always said unless there occurs any Double Feast or day within an Octave: in which case the Feria is commemorated at Vespers, Lauds and Mass.
- 2. On Ferias in Advent, until December 17, when there are no proper Antiphons at Lauds, the Antiphons of the Hours are taken from Lauds of the preceding Sunday. But after December 17, when proper Antiphons are appointed for Lauds on Ferias, the Antiphons of the Hours are taken from the same Antiphons of Lauds.
- 3. In the Ferial Office, the Collect of the preceding Sunday is said (except on the Ember Days when the Collect is proper).
- 4. The Suffrage of the Saints is not said in Advent, through the Octave of the Epiphany inclusive
- 5. In the Ferial Office, the Preces at Prime and Compline are said kneeling. From the I Sunday in Advent through the last day before Christmas Eve, the Short Lesson at Prime (outside Choir) is Domine, miserere nostri ("O Lord, be gracious unto us").
- 6. In the Office of the Advent Season, the proper hymn doxology of the BVM, "All honour, laud, and glory be, O Jesu, Virgin-born, to thee" is not said.
- 7. The Marian Antiphon Alma Redemptoris Mater is said from Vespers of the Saturday before the 1st Sunday in Advent through II Vespers of the Purification (Feb. 2).
- 8. Vigils in Advent are commemorated only at Mass, never in the Office.
- 9. The Saturday Office of the BVM is never said in Advent.

Mass Notes for Advent

- 1. Advent is not a penitential season in the same sense that Lent is, and therefore the use of Alleluia is not barred, but the sanctuary and altars should be adorned somewhat more simply and flowers not employed except on the 3rd Sunday and Christmas Eve.
- 2. In Masses of the Advent Season, Gloria in excelsis is omitted, and "Let us bless the Lord" is said for the Dismissal. But when Mass is of a Feast, Gloria and "Depart in peace" are said.
- 3. From this day up to Dec. 23 inclusive, when they are to be said according to the Rubrics, the Collects assigned for the different seasons, even within Octaves or on Vigils, will be the 2nd of the BVM (Deus, qui de beatæ Mariæ, "O God, who wast pleased") and the 3rd against the persecutors of the Church or for the Metropolitan ("O God, the pastor and ruler"; usually labeled "for the Pope")4: excepting nevertheless the 2nd Collect, which, in

⁴ In Sacramentaries of the 10th century outside of Rome, this particular prayer was applied to bishops in general, not specifically to for the Pope. In light of Bishop JOHN's explanation of the thinking and ecclesiology of the local synod, we should be remembering our Metropolitan as our pastor in this prayer. – Fr Hughes, Vicar General

Masses of the BVM, or those in which she is commemorated, also in a Votive Mass of All Saints, is of the Holy Spirit ("God, who didst teach").

- 4. On Ferias in Advent, when during the week the Sunday Mass is resumed, the Alleluia and its verse are not said, but only the Gradual.
- 5. The Preface of the Most Holy Trinity is said on Sundays in Advent, and the Common Preface is said on Advent Ferias. However, the Priest, at his own discretion, may say the ad libitum Preface of Advent on Sundays and Ferias in Advent. In Masses of the Advent Season, the Preface of the BVM is never said.
- 6. On Sundays and Ferias of Advent (at Mass and in the Office), the organ should not be played (except to support a weak choir), nor should the altar be adorned with flowers, statues, or relics of the Saints.
- 7. At Mass, according to the rubrics, the sacred ministers wear the folded chasubles. But if these are not at hand, they shall wear the alb, without dalmatic or tunicle.
- 8. On the Third Sunday in Advent (Gaudete Sunday), vestments of rose color may be worn; the sacred ministers wear dalmatic and tunicle, the organ may be played, and the altars may be decorated with flowers. (Also, on the Vigil of the Nativity, the altar may be decorated with flowers.)
- 9. In order to foster the devotion of the faithful toward the Divine Redeemer, the pious custom has been introduced in some churches of celebrating on every day in Advent a Votive High Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the so-called "Rorate Mass", which is the first in order among the Votive Masses of the Blessed Virgin. This Mass is said without Gloria (except on Saturday).

Notes for Christmas Day

- The missal provides three Masses for December 25. This is of ancient tradition (5th century). Every priest is allowed to celebrate three Masses on Christmas Day. If he says only one or two of them, he should do so in their proper order and as near the rubrical hours as convenient. St Anastasia is commemorated only at the Dawn Mass.
- 2. Communion may be given at the Midnight Mass. Communicants should follow the Eucharistic Fast from Vespers.
- 3. The 1st Vespers of Christmas Day should be said at the ordinary hour and not postponed to near midnight. The Midnight Mass is properly preceded only with the Office of Matins (the blessing of the Crib might also take place then).
- 4. When Midnight Mass of Christmas Day is followed immediately by Lauds, the Office begins at once with the Versicle Deus in adjutorium. Prime is said in the early morning, after which the 2nd Mass of the Nativity is

offered at daybreak. Terce is said at an appropriate hour, after which the 3rd Mass of the Nativity is offered.

- 5. At each Solemn Mass today the Sacred Ministers, if they are at the sedilia, kneel with bowed head on the lowest step at the Epistle side, facing liturgical north (or at the sedilia) while the choir sings "And was incarnate" in the Creed; or if they are still at the altar they kneel on the edge of the predella.
- 6. No reverence is made during the private reading of the Gospel by the Celebrant; but the genuflexion is made as usual when the Deacon comes to the phrase "And the Word was made flesh" in the 3rd Mass; and also at the words "They fell down and worshipped him" when read by the Celebrant in the Last Gospel at the 3rd Mass.
- It is a laudable and widespread custom at Christmastide to erect within the 7. church a representation of the birthplace of our blessed Redeemer; or at least to exhibit a figure of the divine Infant (the Bambino). This figure may be placed in a prominent position on the altar or on a support nearby (but not in the throne of exposition, or in place of the cross). At the incensations it is censed by the Priest standing, exactly in the same manner as, and after, the altar cross. The Bambino is usually laid in the Christmas Crib immediately before or after the Midnight Mass; or if there be no Midnight Mass, then as near to midnight as may be convenient. If it is desired to make a ceremony of this by carrying the figure in procession (with or without lights and incense) there is no law forbidding it. It is a common custom after solemn services in the Christmas season for the Priest in cope, attended by servers, to visit the Crib-so many of the congregation as can conveniently do so joining in-where popular devotions in honour of the Holy Child are said. If the *Bambino* is censed it should be done by the Priest standing, although the congregation may be kneeling.

From Dec. 29 until Feb. 2 inclusive, when the Prayers assigned for the 1. various Seasons are to be said, according to the Rubrics, they will be as follows: the 2nd of the BVM ("O God, who by the virgin child-bearing") and the 3rd against the persecutors of the Church or for the Metropolitan ("O God, the pastor and ruler"; usually labeled "for the Pope").6 They are said even on Vigils, and within Octaves, excepting the 2nd Collect, which, in Masses of the BVM, and those wherein Commemoration is made of the same, and also in Votive Masses of All Saints, is said of the Holy Spirit ("God, who didst teach").
