- O COME, let us sing unto the / Lord; \* let us heartily rejoice in the strength of / our salvation.
2. Let us come before his presence with thanks/giving; \* and show ourselves / glad in him with psalms.
  3. For the Lord is a great / God; \* and a great / King above all gods.
  4. In his hand are all the corners of the / earth; \* and the strength of the hills / is his also.
  5. The sea is his, and he / made it; \* and his hands pre/pared the dry land.
  6. O come, let us worship and fall / down, \* and kneel before the / Lord our Maker.
  7. For he is the Lord our / God; \* and we are the people of his pasture, and the / sheep of his hand.
  8. Today if ye will hear his voice, harden not your / hearts \* as in the provocation, and as in the day of temptation / in the wilderness;
  9. When your fathers / tempted me, \* proved / me, and saw my works.
  10. Forty years long was I grieved with this generation, and / said, \* It is a people that do err in their hearts, for they / have not known my ways:
  11. Unto whom I swear in my / wrath, \* that they should not en/ter into my rest.

- O SING unto the / Lord a new song; \* sing unto the Lord, / all the whole earth.
2. Sing unto the / Lord, and praise his Name; \* be telling of his salva/tion from day to day.
3. Declare his honor un/to the heathen, \* and his wonders un/to all peoples.
4. For the Lord is great, and cannot / worthily be praised; \* he is more to be / feared than all gods.
5. As for all the gods of the heathen, / they are but idols; \* but it is the Lord that / made the heavens.
6. Glory and / worship are before him; \* power and honor are in his / sanctuary.
7. Ascribe unto the Lord, O ye kindreds / of the peoples, \* ascribe unto the Lord wor/ship and power.
8. Ascribe unto the Lord the honor / due unto his Name; \* bring presents, and / come into his courts.
9. O worship the Lord in the / beauty of holiness; \* let the whole earth / stand in awe of him.
10. Tell it out among the heathen, that the Lord is King, † and that it is he who hath made the round world so fast that it / cannot be moved; \* and how that he shall judge the / peoples righteously.
11. Let the heavens rejoice, and / let the earth be glad; \* let the sea make a noise, and / all that therein is.
12. Let the field be joyful, and / all that is in it; \* then shall all the trees of the wood re/joyce before the Lord.
13. For he cometh, for he / cometh to judge the earth; \* and with righteousness to judge the world, and the / peoples with his truth.

  11. There is sprung up a light for the / righteous, \* and joyful gladness  
 for such as / are true-hearted.
  12. Rejoice in the Lord, ye / righteous; \* and give thanks for a  
 remembrance / of his holiness.
